Castle Coole (National Trust)

Experience the stately grandeur of this stunning 18th-century mansion set in a beautiful wooded landscape park ideal for family walks.

Castle Coole is one of Ireland's finest Neo-classical houses, allowing visitors to glimpse what life was like in the home of the Earls of Belmore.



Discover the story of the people who lived and worked below stairs as you explore the splendid suite of servants rooms and service quarters of this magnificent property.

Florence Court (National Trust)

Surrounded by lush parkland and thick woodland with Benaughlin mountain rising in the background, Florence Court enjoys a majestic countryside setting in West Fermanagh. There is something for everyone to enjoy at this extensive and welcoming place.

On a guided tour of the Georgian mansion you can hear stories about the Cole family and their staff, who lived

here for over 250 years.

Outdoors take a gentle walk or long cycle along 10 miles of trails in the adjoining forest park and see fascinating industrial heritage features, including the water-powered sawmill and blacksmith's forge. The gardens are home to the mother of all Irish yew trees, as well as the kitchen garden which is being restored to its 1930s character.

Marble Arch Caves

Explore this underworld labyrinth on a guided walking tour as you trace the journey of the Owenbrean River and discover its energy as the waters gurgle and splash venturing deeper into the black abyss.

Stroll through the wooded nature reserve to the imposing cave entrance to take the renowned boat journey up the subterranean Cladagh River. Disembark and follow the pathway whilst enjoying the tranquil ambiance as you meander through chambers and passages discovering the abundance of delicate formations.
